

The giant panda is one of the world's most loved animals. It is easily identified by its black and white fur. A newborn panda cub is blind, hairless and tiny. Completely helpless, the cub cannot move much on its own for nearly three months. The mother is very protective and careful in caring for her cub during this time.

Pandas are among the most endangered animals in the world. There are only about 1600 of them living in the wild. One of the main reasons pandas have become endangered is that their habitat is being destroyed. In order to develop the land, humans destroy the areas pandas live in. Due to this, pandas are being forced to live in smaller areas in the wild which are not as suitable.

Destroying their habitat also leads to food shortages. Though they may be fed food like carrots in zoos, nearly the entire diet of pandas in the wild consists of bamboo. Pandas eat between ten and twenty kilograms of bamboo a day. They feed on several types that bloom at different times of the year. If one type of bamboo is destroyed, pandas may have nothing to eat, increasing the risk of starvation. Hence, pandas may occasionally hunt small rodents and eat fish when available.

People are making efforts to save the pandas. Wildlife reserves have been set up in parts of China to make sure they have a home. Care is taken to help them survive in the wild. Scientists also study how pandas breed to help increase their numbers.
