From then on, Vanita never looked in the mirror again.



Mr Sing's day begins at 11.30 a.m. When he gets tired, he pulls out his plastic stool to sit on. His stall does not have a signboard so many people simply pass by without a second glance. Mr Sing has been peddling kacang puteh for about 15 years.

Before popcorn invaded cinemas, people picked up cones of kacang puteh from sellers like Mr Sing to munch through a movie. At that time, kacang puteh sellers, dressed in their white shirts and sarongs, would roam the streets. The sellers 10 carried their kacang puteh in bags that were neatly arranged in a wooden box. They would call out to customers to buy their kacang puteh. They sold the kacang puteh in cones made of newspaper or torn pages from magazines.

Tougher times are ahead for Mr Sing whose business has dwindled in recent years. He used to make about \$700 to \$800 a month but he makes only about 15 \$200 monthly now. Kacang puteh is no longer appealing to the younger generation who prefers popcorn to the traditional snack.

*Kacang puteh are roasted, salted or sweetened nuts eaten as snacks.
