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Comprehension 2 (10 marks) Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Honeybees live in colonies with one queen running the whole hive. Worker honeybees are all females and are the only bees most people ever see flying around outside of the hive. They forage for food, build the honeycombs and protect the hive.

Many species of honeybees are disappearing from hives due to Colony Collapse Disorder. This is a situation when the majority of the worker bees in a colony disappear, leaving behind their queen. Scientists are not sure what is causing this collapse.

Honeybees are important pollinators for flowers, fruits, and vegetables. They live on stored honey and pollen all winter and cluster into a ball to conserve warmth.

All honeybees are social and cooperative insects. Members of the hive are divided into three types. Workers forage for nutrients, build and protect the hive, as well as clean and circulate the air by beating their wings.

The queen's job is simple—she lays the eggs that will produce the hive's next generation of bees. There is usually only a single queen in a hive. If the queen dies, workers will create a new queen by feeding one of the female worker bees a special food called 'royal jelly'. This enables the bee to develop into a fertile queen.

Male bees are called drones—the third type of honeybee. Several hundred drones live in each hive, fed by the female worker bees only during spring and summer. However, during the winter months, unable to feed themselves, drones quickly die.
