The ofter family was still asleep but would be up any minute now. Soon, I spotted the first ofter. Then, I heard high-pitched squeaks as more ofters awoke. They swam along the river, catching fish. One ofter fried to snatch a fish from another. Others engaged in playfighting. Meanwhile, an older ofter taught the younger ones how to fish. When some offers got fired of treading water while chomping down fish, they carried the food to the riverbank to eat. The offers rested till late afternoon and fished again in the river before dark.

Although otters are native to Singapore, they were not seen much before the 1990s. There are now ten ofter families and they occupy mangroves, coasts, reservoirs, rivers and canals. The increase in the number of otters is due to the abundance of clean water and fish along our waterways.
