Soon, people all over the world wanted to solve the cube. After two years, the Rubik's Cube became the most popular puzzle in history!

To most people, the 27 tiny cubes would seem straightforward at first, but it has proven to be a truly tough puzzle. Each tiny cube carried one of six colours. Rubik's first challenge was figuring out a way for the cubes to move without falling apart. His second challenge was finding a solution to his own puzzle. It took him a whole month but eventually, he did it!

The world record time for solving a 3x3x3 Rubik's Cube is 3.47 seconds. set by Du Yusheng from China in 2018. However, Rubik does not like the idea of players memorizing the methods of solving the cube puzzle and training their fingers to move the tiny cubes speedily. Instead, he believes that it is important for players to find creative ways to solve the puzzle.
