

They are fine. They are sharp. They all have one thing in common: they can lear animals into shreds. In the wild, birds of prey are hunters which dominate the skies. The largest of them all – the Andean Condor – has a wingspan of three metres. Although rare today, the remaining population of this species inhabit the Andean mountain range of Colombia, Chile, Equador and 5 Peru in South America.

It is one of the seven species of American vultures in the world, which are distinct for not having feathers on their heads and necks. This enables the vultures to dip their heads with ease into carcasses while feeding. Like other birds of prey, vultures have large, strong and sharply hooked beaks, but their 10 stender legs and toes with blunt talons are not well suited for killing preys.

Instead, they are experts at soaring, and their excellent eyesight enables them to detect carrion – the decaying flesh of dead animals – from afar. Those who live in forests have a keen-sense of smell, and are even able to nose out covered carcasses on the forest floor.

The King Vulture, another species of American vulture, lives in deep tropical forests and builds its nests high in the tree tops. It scours the forest floor for dead animals, and if it cannot find any, will kill and eat small reptiles and calves.

Vultures are often mistaken to be vicious and dirty birds because they 20 feed on carcasses. They are actually one of the cleanest birds, making sure that they wash or sun themselves after every single meal.

The Secretary Bird found in Africa has a distinctive long crest of twenty feathers. It derives its name from these feathers on its fread which remind us of the olden day lawyer's secretary with a bunch of quilt pens stuck behind his 25 ears.

This bird of prey prefers running on the ground to flying. When it does fly, however, it is quite graceful with its head and neck outstretched and its long legs neatly tucked beneath its tail. It is a large bird, standing more than a metre tall on powerful legs, and an impressive wingspan of two metres. Due to its 30 unique structure and appearance, it is placed in a family by itself – comprising

only one species.

Another bird of prey is the owl. Also known as the cat with wings, it is the silent hunter of the night. Most owl species are active at nightfall and only a few hunt in the day. Like hawks and eagles, owls have hooked beaks and powerful 35 talons; but the owls keep their weapons well hidden under their feathers.

The size, construction and position of the owl's eyes give it its amazing eyesight – 10 to 100 times sharper than man's. Its ears are very sensitive to high-pitched sounds made by rodents, while the wing feathers of the nocturnal owl have silencing devices which ensure a completely silent flight.
