

statues in hot waters. Some scientists wanted to prove that capybaras truly enjoy the
experience, so they decided carry out a study. They photographed a
group of nine capybaras carefully as bathed in a hot spring for three
weeks. Whenever the capybaras first the hot spring, a photograph
would be taken of their faces above water level. This step was done (10)
after thirty minutes. Both sets of images would then be compared to find out if there were
changes in two of their features.
If their ears were pinned back and if their eyes were closed after thirty minutes,
the scientists would record them as having attained state of bliss due
to the hot spring water. The opposite would be true if their ears were facing the front and
if their Were wide open. Such a display would mean that the
capybaras werefeeling blissful.
An important difference was seen the pictures taken before (15)
and during their baths. With the passing of, their eyelids would droop,
low, almost fully closed, the position of their ears remained (17)
unchanged. Due to this observation, the study could not actually prove that capybaras
truly enjoy their hot spring baths. Interestingly, the scientists noticed that each capybara
had soft and smooth skin soaking in the hot spring. This finding led
the scientists to encourage people to visit hot springs to their skins soft and smooth too. The exicutions and their skins
