There is little movement of air and you sweat profusely, especially if you are
travelling. Drink several quarts of water everyday to (51)your

Carlo could see a lake and in the distance, a snow-capped mountain. In a moment, clouds covered the moon again and the mountain and the lake were hidden once more behind the widow's veil. Carlo preferred it this way as the darkness lent an appropriate tone to their flight.

Gradually, the rowing became more challenging, the distance covered by each stroke less and less significant. The sky was getting brighter. If there had been any guards patrolling the roads just then, the fugitives would have been spotted easily.
