Have you ever heard someone use the phrase "once in a blue moon"? People use this expression to describe something that does not happen very often. For example, someone may say that he tries to avoid eating sweets because they are unhealthy, but will eat chocolate "once in a blue moon". Another person who does not usually like to go to the beach may say, "I visit the seashore once in a blue moon." While many people use this phrase, not everyone knows its meaning. 5

The first thing to know is that the moon itself is never actually blue. This is just an expression. The phrase "blue moon" actually has to do with the shape of the moon, not the colour.

As the moon travels around the earth, it appears to change shape. We use certain names for certain phases of the moon. For example, when we see a small part of the moon, it is called a crescent moon. A crescent is a shape that looks like the tip of a finger. When we cannot see the moon at all, it is called a new moon. When we can see the entire moon, it is called a full moon. 10

Usually, there is only one full moon every month. Sometimes, however, there will be two full moons in one month. When this happens, the second full moon is called a "blue moon". 15

Over the next twenty years, there will only be fifteen "blue moons". As you can see, a "blue moon" is a very rare event. This fact has led people to use the expression "once in a blue moon" to describe other very rare events in their lives. 20

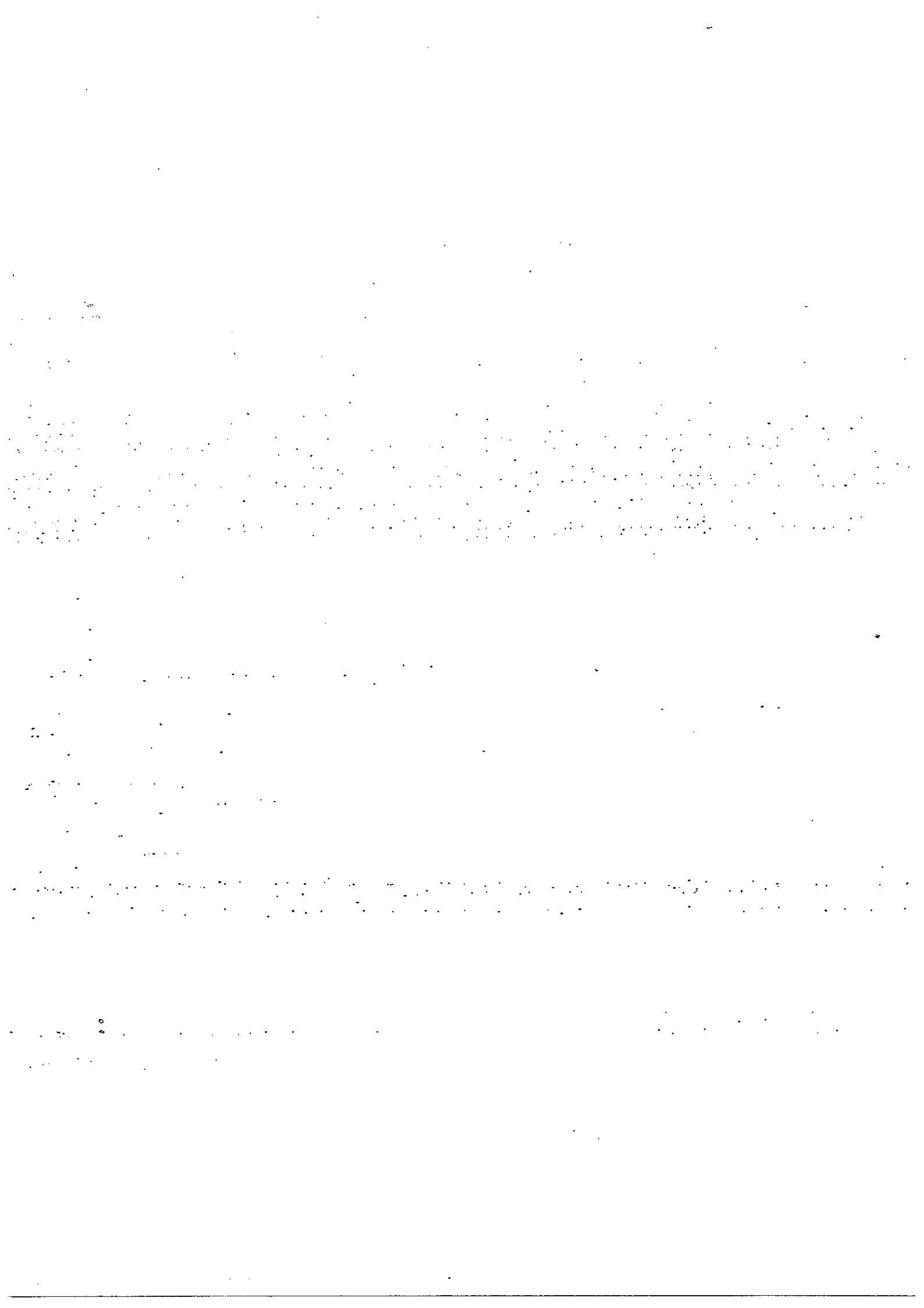
