

In order to avoid any squabbles with her, the whole family would wake up much earlier than Grandma to have our showers. Imagine visiting our relatives' homes with itchy heads! That would be unbearable!

Grandma also disallows us from using any foul language or unlucky words on this day. Before we have our breakfast, she would ensure that all of us queue up in front of her and greet her with auspicious words. In return, we would each receive a red packet from her. For the rest of the day, we could not make any references to the past year as we are taught to look forward to a new beginning. Following that, a new year of superstitions starts once again!
