The story of Christy Brown, a talented writer, reads like a modern miracle. Christy was born in a slum about fifty years ago. After his birth, doctors discovered that he had severe cerebral palsy, a serious neurological disorder which left him almost paralysed. He was so severely handicapped from brain damage at birth that doctors deemed the condition hopeless.

Though urged to commit him to a convalescent hospital, Brown's parents refused and subsequently raised him at home with their other children. During his adolescence, social worker Katrina Delahunt became aware of his story and began to visit the Brown family regularly. Since young, Christy had demonstrated keen interest in arts and literature. Katrina would bring books and painting materials for him. Soon, Christy had learned to write and draw by himself with the only limb which he could control — his left foot.

The transformation of Christy Brown was not a miracle that happened overnight. There was no sudden cure or miraculous drug that brought about the change. It came only through Christy's own courage and determination. Added to this, was the boundless love and patience of his mother, who knew in her heart that there was a great talent within her child. She tenderly coaxed and encouraged him through all the long, painful years as he learned to read and write.

Besides his mother, another person who helped Christy was Professor Robert Collis. He was Christy's medical and literary guide and friend. Professor Collis first saw Christy when he was seven years old at a children's Christmas party. The boy was balanced on the back of his elder brother who was trotting through the crowd during a game. It was Christy's childish enthusiasm that caught the professor's attention. Professor Collis met Christy again five years later. He had just opened the clinic for children like Christy. After tracking down the boy's family, he persuaded Christy's mother to send him to the new clinic. It was Professor Collis who read Christy's writing and discovered that it was a great literary piece. It was he who advised Christy on publishing his work and found him a publisher.

The professor used his own connections to publish My Left Foot, an autobiographical account of Christy's struggle with everyday life.

On Saturday, 26 April 2003, without telling anyone his plans, Aron Ralston went hiking alone. Armed with his hiking boots, his backpack, climbing equipment, and, notably, a pocket-sized utility tool, Aron put his mountain bike in the back of his truck and drove almost five hours to a remote part of Utah.

The day started off well as Aron went swimming with two friends in an idyllic, tranquil pool hidden in one of the canyons. It is only after he left them to continue his hike that disaster struck. Leaving his bike, Aron continued on foot into Bluejohn Canyon. Conquering the canyon required considerable canyoneering skills. For Aron, that enabled him to negotiate the canyon without much difficulty.

Being accustomed to far riskier environments, Aron likened his hike in such dangerous 10 terrain to that of a walk in the park. Suddenly, he slipped and fell down the chasm, inadvertently dislodging a 360kg boulder. It crushed his arm and left Aron pinned against the canyon wall.

Initially, Aron made several futile attempts to chip away at the boulder with his utility knife – but it was already fairly blunt and that just made it worse. That first night, as darkness descended upon him, Aron realised just how alone he was.

The boulder was crushing his wrist so tightly that everything up to his fingertips was numb. Without a doubt, he knew the tissue had died. He began stabbing the blade of his knife into the dead skin of his thumb. He could hear the air escaping from the decomposing digit. He realised that he was going to have to cut his arm off to get free but he did not want to do it. Resigned to his fate, it was not surprising that Aron was entertaining morbid thoughts of his demise.

However, after five and a half days inside the canyon, delirious from dehydration, Aron suddenly felt his bone bend. Half-worried that he was hallucinating, he continued to tug and move his arm. After several movements, Aron was convinced that he was lucid. He realised he could use the boulder to break it. With an ironical sense of optimism, Aron knew he was going to get out of there.

Aron managed to use his body weight to violently bend his arm until the boulder snapped his forearm. Then with his utility knife, he proceeded to cut off his arm. It was extremely traumatic but at the end of his unimaginable deed, Aron found himself laughing hysterically — so elated was he to be able to get out of there. Still in survival mode, Aron then made a makeshift sling. Then he rappelled down the cliff face, yet another amazing feat. Covered in blood, he began marching out of the canyon. A family out hiking found him and called the emergency services.

Rescuers tried to keep Aron awake for the 12-minute flight to the hospital in Moab. When 35 they got there, he continued to stun them by walking into the emergency room on his own.

The incident has somewhat humbled Aron. His advice to all hikers: 'If you want someone to show up and help you if something bad happens, you'd better tell someone where you're going.'
