Steve Irwin was well-known as the "Crocodile Hunter" on television. He was a committed conservationist, running a wildlife park for crocodiles and other Australian fauna, including kangaroos, koalas and possums. He also used some of his wealth to buy land for use as natural habitat.

He would usually be in khaki shorts, shirt and heavy boots in his television programmes. He would creep up to lions, chase and be chased by komodo dragons, and stare eye-to-eye with poisonous snakes. Often, his trademark finish was to hunt down one of the huge crocodiles that live in the rivers and beaches in Australia. He would leap onto its back, grab its jaws with his bare hands and tie its mouth with a rope.

On 4<sup>th</sup> September 2006, Steve Irwin died doing what he loved best, getting close to one of the dangerous animals he had dedicated his life to protecting. His heart was pierced by the poisonous spine of a stingray while shooting a new television programme, "Ocean's Deadliest" on the Great Barrier Reef.
