Spiders are not insects. They belong to a class of animals called arachnids. Spiders have eight eyes and four pairs of legs. A spider is able to grow a new leg if it loses one. It does not have antennae and wings. A spider's body is divided into two sections. The sections are the abdomen and the thorax. The legs, eyes and mouth are found in the thorax.

Most spiders have poisonous fangs which they use to inject a poisonous liquid into other insects to paralyse them. Once the insect is unable to move the spiders can then eat it.

Spiders can live almost anywhere in the world. There are about 30 000 different types of spiders. Most of them are small animals. They can be found in dry or cold places. Some spiders like to live underground while others in the trees. Spiders can also be seen in homes.

Spiders have silk glands which can be found below their abdomen. Each gland produces a liquid thicker than water and is used for spinning a web. This liquid will dry up when it is exposed to air.

The Tarantula is a giant spider which many people are afraid of. It can stretch itself to more than 10 centimetres long. It is commonly found in warm places.

Any person under the age of eighteen years old is not allowed to be seen smoking in public areas.

This includes holding onto a cigarette whether it is lit or unlit. They are also prohibited from buying cigarettes.

If someone who is below eighteen is caught smoking for the first time, the person will have to undergo counselling and pay a fine. If he is caught again, he will have to pay a heavier fine.
