Cassowaries are large, flightless birds. An adult male can reach 1.8 metres in height and may weigh more than 50 kilogrammes. Adult females are even more massive. Unlike a male, the female's foot stretches beyond 210 millimetres.

The males look after the chicks. If you get close to one with young chicks, he may charge at you to protect them. If you try to feed a cassowary, it can become aggressive and 5 demanding. However, when left to themselves, cassowaries are harmless.

Bertha, a male cassowary, and his three chicks strut around. Occasionally, he tucks his head down, inflates his neck and makes low booming noises. This causes the chicks to cuddle up to him when he sits down.

Bertha's chicks have different temperaments. Tidi is adventurous and likes to wander 10 off. Bertha constantly booms to remind it to stay close. A timid chick, Kopipi, often seeks its father's attention. Frequently, they touch the tips of their bills together. The chicks also pick ticks off their father's neck and eat them.

Bertha and his chicks feast mainly on fruit. Sometimes, they stop under the nest of an eagle in a nearby tree to see if food - a dead lizard or a snake - has been dropped. As 15 cassowaries wander through the forest, they spread seeds through their fruit-scented droppings.
