Olivia, Zoe's classmate, brings food from home too. However, what stands out is not the food but the little notes that her mother, Mrs Tan, leaves in her lunchbox. She would write a joke or a simple message, 'Have a good day in school!' and put it in the lunchbox. The 15 notes always brighten Olivia's day.

Mrs Tan prepares Olivia's lunchbox the night before as she does not have enough time to do it in the morning. Olivia feels that packing lunch is a good idea although the food sometimes becomes soggy. Home-cooked meals are also tastier and healthier than canteen food.
