

The fried chickens were so popular that the governor of Kentucky gave him the title Kentucky Colonel'. Kentucky Fried Chicken expanded internationally and it can be found in many countries around the world today.

Sanders passed on at the age of 90.

Even today, Sanders with his famous goatee, a white suit and a western string tie continues to symbolize delicious country fried chicken all over the world.
