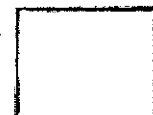

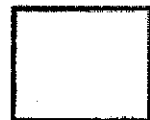

She was stunned to see a dead cobra lying on the floor near her son who was still sound asleep in his cradle. Having realised her mistake, she ran out and found the mongoose dead. 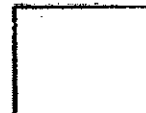
