With rhythmical sweeps of its tail, (the humpback whale swam in the oceans east of Australia) Humpback whales typically travel thousands of kilometres, once a year in the summer, to feed. This creature was beginning its migration to the rich feeding grounds of Antarctica.

While on its way, it failed to notice the shark net anchored off the coast near Brisbane. It swam right into it. Within seconds, six hundred metres of braided nylon mesh and rope covered the whale. (It was unable to reverse because humpbacks cannot swim backwards. It could not move forward either because the net was secured to the ocean bed by a hundred kilograms of chain and two heavy anchors) In an effort to break free, the whale spun around and threw itself out of the water. The net wrapped even more tightly around it. The creature struggled to surface for air. Although bound by a massive weight of rope and chain and one anchor, the whale was still motivated by its natural (instinct) and strong desire to continue on its journey south.

Some time later, the marine centre in Queensland received a call that a whale in distress had been spotted and a rescue team was (hastily put together) After hours of useless searching, the captain of the rescue team received a message on his marine radio. The whale had strayed from its migratory path and it was not alone. Humpbacks sing to one another across stretches of ocean and support injured companions, so the whale was joined by three others. Now that there were four whales present, the rescue mission suddenly became (potentially) dangerous.

As the divers approached the trapped whale, they lowered themselves into the water to assess the situation. The divers began cutting through the net in which the whale was caught. It was exhausting work. Since the whale was moving forward, the divers had to swim back to its head to start again. At first, the whale splashed about wildly but after watching the divers intently as they worked on their rescue mission, it grew calmer as it sensed that they wanted only to help. One of its companions swam underneath and gently pushed its head to the surface, helping the whale to breathe.

The long hours spent trapped in many strands of rope and chains had weakened the whale and it did not react when the divers prepared for the final cut to set it free. Eventually the rope gave way and the whale was finally free. Minutes passed and still the whale did not respond. Then, at last, it slowly swam away from the boat.

Picking up speed, it headed towards its companions. When it reached them, all four mammals began tail-slapping the water, as if applauding the achievement of the rescue team. Then, they swam south towards Antarctica.
