



When using the escalator

- · Keep left and let others pass on your right
- Give way to children, pregnant women and the elderly

When waiting for the train

- Stand behind the yellow line at the platform
- When the train arrives, stand to the side of the door and give way to alighting passengers



During the train journey

- Move to the middle of the car to make room for others to board
- Offer your seat to someone who needs it more
- Respect others by not playing music or talking too loudly

OD NOT

- Block the landing of the escalator or the landing of the staircase
- Use the escalator if you are carrying bulky items, in a wheelchair or are feeling unwell (Please use the lift instead.)

I thought I had no recollection of my primary school days, but a recent gathering where I met my primary schoolmates brought back memories of school.

Ah Huat was one of my closest friends in school. He almost had to stop school, but a dedicated teacher, Miss Lim, found a solution for him to continue pursuing his education while fulfilling his duties as a son. He came from a very poor family. When he got home every night, he had to help his father make shoes. He had to complete several pairs each evening before he was allowed to go to bed. One day, we had a spelling test. Ah Huat did not look very well on arriving at school and when Miss Lim mentioned the test, he turned pale.) 0.12

After marking the spelling test, Miss Lim called Ah Huat to see her.

"Ah Huat, you haven't spelt a single word correctly," Miss Lim said.

"Then you know you must do better than this. Do you think you can succeed in your studies if you continue to score so badly in your test?" Miss Lim reprimanded.

At that, Ah Huat burst into tears, saying, "I'm sorry, teacher, but I had to work last 15 night."

"Work? For whom?" Miss Lim asked.

("My father. I had to help make twenty pairs of shoes before going to bed. I wanted to study, but my father wouldn't let me.) He said I had to help him earn some money and I was wasting his money by going to school," Ah Huat answered.

"Never mind," Miss Lim finally said a little uneasily, as her face turned red. "Just try to use your time in school carefully, and do as much homework as possible here."

We thought Miss Lim handled the situation rather well. She was a new teacher, and did not know much about our different backgrounds.

Besides this, I also recalled an incident when I was nearly punished. A very tall 25 student used to sit in front of me, and I could not see the blackboard. I tried to see, by moving to the left or the right of him but every time I did that, he would also move left or right and continue, quite deliberately, to block my view. One day, I got so frustrated that I jabbed a pencil into his back. I did it so hard that the pencil lead was stuck in his skin! Mr Tan, the teacher, wanted to send me to the principal. I was scared and clung to the wire 30 mesh by the window. Mr Tan saw red. After some time, he gave up and did not move me physically. He was not that harsh on me as he knew the circumstances and had seen the student in front of me blocking my view on many occasions.

Not long after, I had a taste of my own medicine. It was only when I got jabbed with a pencil myself when playing in the school playground that I realised how painful it was. Another boy did it - he was making a gesture with his pencil and I just happened to get in the way. It bled and hurt. The scar remains, serving as a reminder for me to treat everyone with patience and kindness.
