Although plastic shopping bags are cheap and useful, their disposal causes
widespread pollution. That is the non-biodegradable polyethylene which
plastic is made of takes centuries to decompose. Now, we may have an unlikely ally to help
clean up our trash – a small wax worm.
Dr Federica Bertocchini, a biologist, stumbled the worm's hidden (30)
