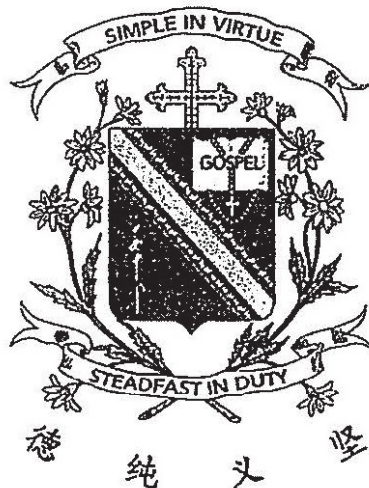

Recently, there has been a spate of food poisoning reports in Asia where food is either handled or stored wrongly at food centres. However, many food poisoning cases go unreported, especially if the foodborne illness is not fatal or serious. By practising hygiene prior to handling and storing food and making sure that all utensils and surfaces are clean, food contamination can be kept at bay. Food safety is vital at home too. Home cooks need to keep to three fundamental procedures for food safety at home: Clean, Separate and Store.
