



N.E.mation is here again! N.E.mation is an annual inter-school digital animation competition organised by Nexus, the Ministry of Defence's (MINDEF) Central National Education Office, for students from secondary schools to express their thoughts on Total Defence. More than 17 000 pupils have taken part in it since its inception in 2009! With the help of professionals in digital animation, students with no experience in animation are trained to produce broadcast-quality clips for many media platforms, including free-to-air television. Some of these clips have won awards at international animation festivals!

The theme for this year, "Together We Keep Singapore Strong", highlights how Total Defence remains as our best all-round response to the threats and challenges that Singapore faces on all fronts -- military, civil, economic, social, psychological and digital. Through their animation clips, students offer their perspective of Total Defence and show how people can put Total Defence into action, in their everyday lives.

Eligibility:

- The competition is open only to secondary school students aged between 13 and 16. They must be:
 - Singaporeans or
 - Permanent Residents or
 - Foreign Students holding student pass
- Each team should comprise 3 to 4 participating students, with a maximum of one student pass holder only.
- Each student can be part of only <u>one</u> team. Each team can only consist of members from the same secondary school.
- Each participating school must have a teacherin-charge as contact person for their team(s).

Judging:

- The animation clips produced by the top 10 teams will be judged by a panel of judges and the public.
- The public can vote for their three favourite clips on our Facebook page.

Prizes:

- The champion team will win a trip to renowned animation studios overseas.
- The top 10 finalists will have their clips broadcast on various media platforms.
