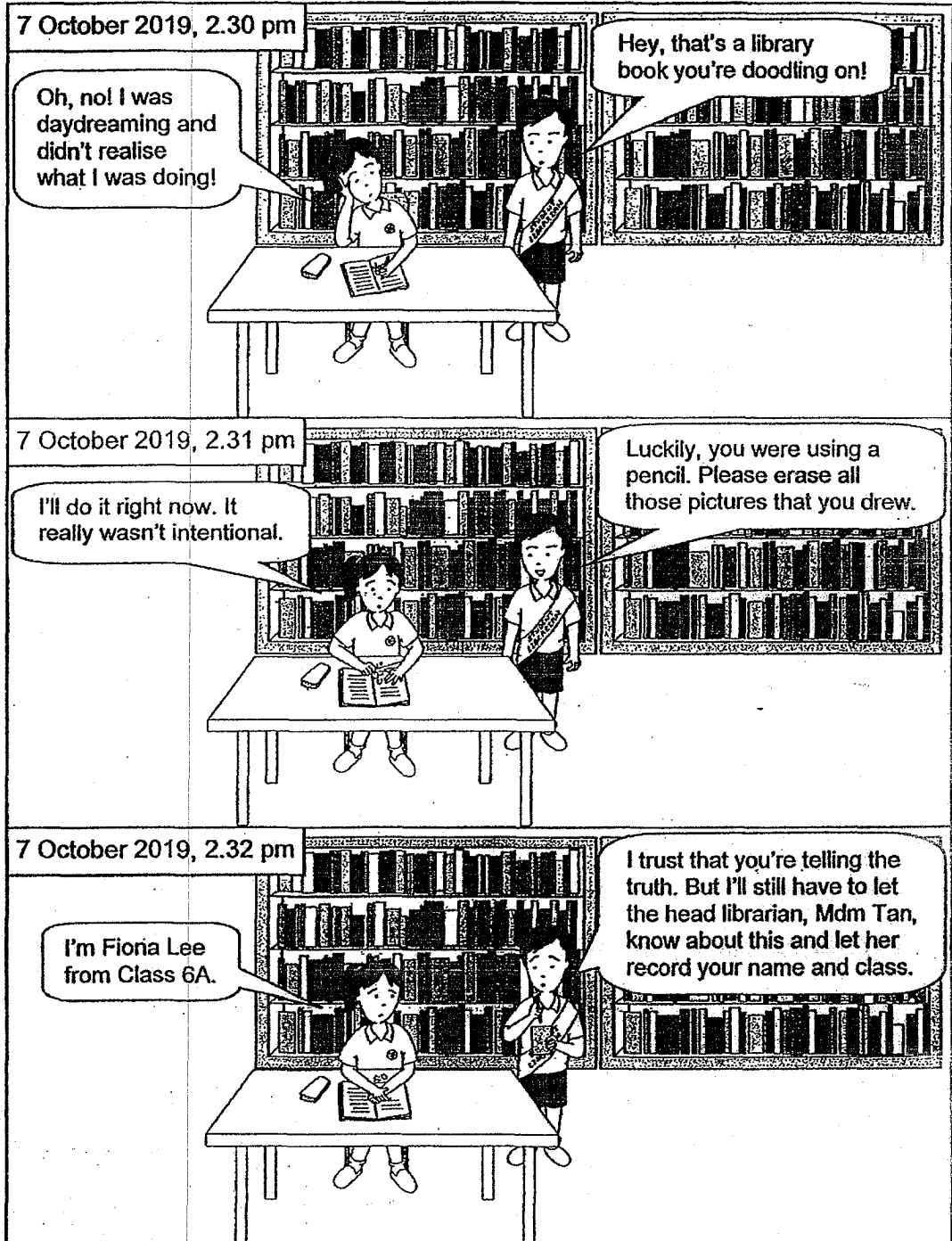

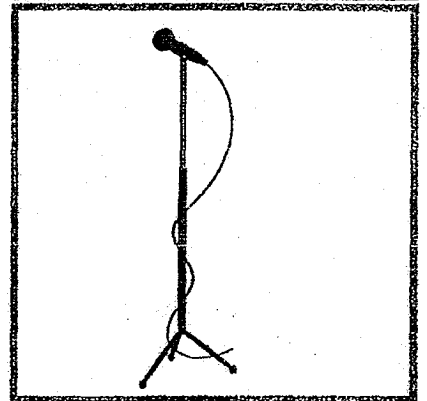
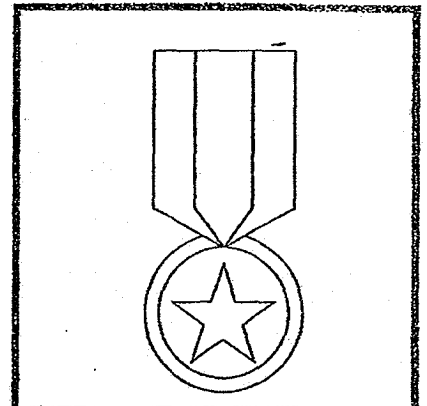

Linen is a natural fibre made from the stalk of a plant. It was the first fibre used to weave fabric and dates back over 8000 years. First used by Mediterranean civilisations, it was quickly adopted by Europe and it became popular during the medieval times. It was the most readily available fabric and remained the most popular even after the introduction of cotton fabrics by the Arabs during the 1300s.

Linen remained the fabric of choice until the eighteenth century when the introduction of spinning machines became much more affordable than the traditional linen techniques.

Presently, because of the laborious time it takes to produce linen, and the manual processes that have to be undertaken, linen has become a higher-priced commodity. It is considered, among many, to be a "luxury" fabric.

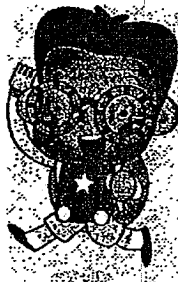
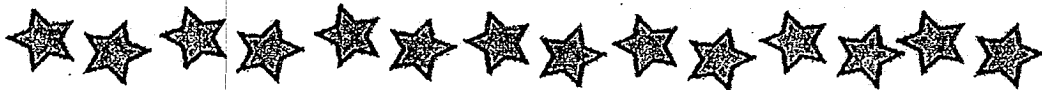
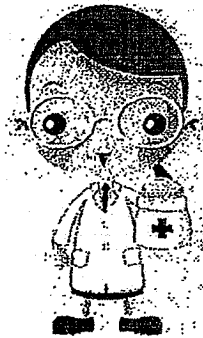
Let's Keep Myopia in Check!

If you live in Singapore, you probably know what myopia is. Myopia, the medical name of short-sightedness, is commonly mentioned in schools as more than half the children here have the condition by the time they are 12 years old.

"Let's Keep Myopia in Check!" is a campaign that was first launched in 2014 to drive home an important message. The campaign organiser, Health Focus Singapore (HFS), wants young children and their parents to understand that having good eye care habits can bring myopia under control.

In the first few years, the campaign targeted primary school students. Eye care teams from HFS visited each school biannually to conduct eye checks and give assembly talks. The campaign received positive responses and support from various sources increased. By 2017, the number of eye care teams had tripled. That allowed HFS to start sending teams to pre-schools as well. This year, HFS plans to celebrate the campaign's fifth anniversary by engaging the general public in a wide range of activities that promote good eye care.
