



Taking on a pet rabbit is an important decision. Kept correctly, the rabbit will be happy and will offer you years of pleasure. Getting it wrong means an unhappy situation for both you and the bunny. So, how will having a rabbit in the house affect you, your family and your home?

Before you welcome your rabbit, you may need to modify your home 5 environment. How much of the house can your bunny access? Some areas, such as a raised balcony that a rabbit could fall from, may need to be shut off. You will also need a cage until your rabbit is fully trained. A cage can take up a lot of space.

As a rabbit owner, you will need to be prepared for your pet to inflict some wear and tear on your furnishings. Young rabbits are capable of stripping wallpaper, nibbling carpets and damaging furniture. You will need to 'bunny-proof' your home to make sure it is safe for the rabbit. Starting off with a cage is advisable, unless you are willing to put up with significant mess and damage to the house.

Rabbits will also shed hair and sometimes drag a bit of hay on to the carpet. You will need to sweep the rabbit living area daily. If a bit of mess drives you up the wall, then an indoor bunny will cause you more stress than pleasure.

Furthermore, if you already have other pets, you need to work out how a rabbit will fit in. Rabbits are quite happy to rest during the day, but they will need company and interaction in the mornings and the evenings. Unless you are at home most evenings, your rabbit will be lonely.

Be sure that everyone living in your home is eager to have a house rabbit and that they understand the restrictions. For example, everyone will need to remember not to leave books on the floor as they will be nibbled on. Children will naturally want to hold their pets, but must do so carefully. Rabbits will kick, scratch and bite if they feel insecure, and many rabbits die from spinal injuries after being dropped by children. Thus, an adult needs 25 to take on the responsibility for the rabbit.

A rabbit can usually live for seven to ten years. The initial costs of the cage and other equipment can be rather high, though day-to-day expenses only amount to a few dollars a week. Beyong these costs, taking on a rabbit is a long-term commitment. Are you ready for a rabbit?


