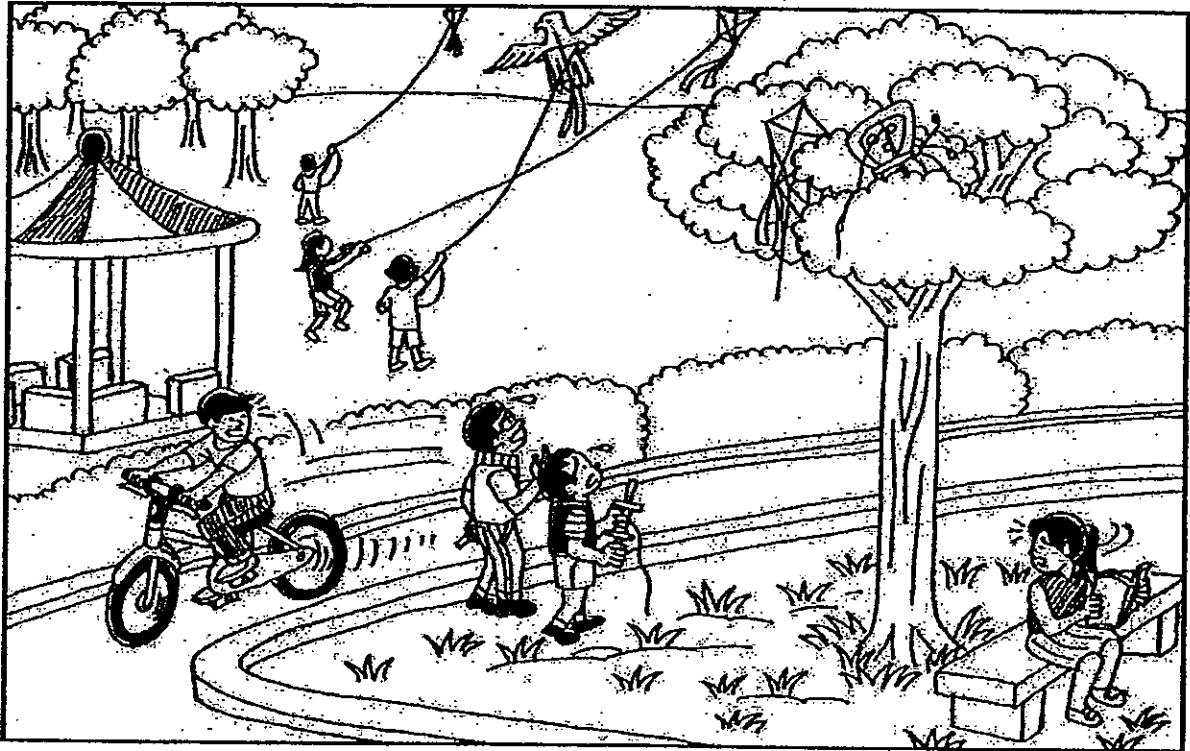

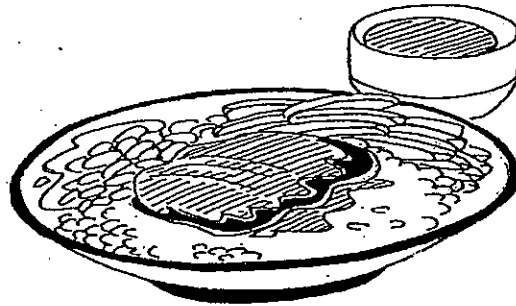

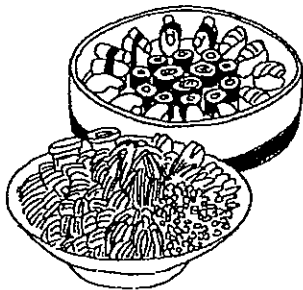

Reefs are often referred to as the rainforests of the sea. They attract more marine life than anywhere else in the ocean because of the natural shelter they provide. However, they are dwindling worldwide, and scientists fear that they may all be gone by 2050.

"Coral reefs provide protection for our coastal areas, habitat for fish and recreational opportunities for millions," Ken Nedimyer, a commercial fisherman, said.

Reefs also have great economic value. Many people around the world depend on fisheries and the ocean for their livelihood. If coral reefs die completely, entire economies will be affected.

That passion led to Nedimyer starting a project to grow more than 25,000 corals in underwater nurseries. The impact is already noticeable in areas where corals have been transplanted. Fish and other marine life are starting to come back, and Nedimyer is hopeful that in time, the ecosystem will recover.

Taking on a pet rabbit is an important decision. Kept correctly, the rabbit will be happy and will offer you years of pleasure. Getting it wrong means an unhappy situation for both you and the bunny. So, how will having a rabbit in the house affect you, your family and your home?

Before you welcome your rabbit, you may need to modify your home environment. How much of the house can your bunny access? Some areas, such as a raised balcony that a rabbit could fall from, may need to be shut off. You will also need a cage until your rabbit is fully trained. A cage can take up a lot of space. 5

As a rabbit owner, you will need to be prepared for your pet to inflict some wear and tear on your furnishings. Young rabbits are capable of stripping wallpaper, nibbling carpets and damaging furniture. You will need to 'bunny-proof' your home to make sure it is safe for the rabbit. Starting off with a cage is advisable, unless you are willing to put up with significant mess and damage to the house. 10

Rabbits will also shed hair and sometimes drag a bit of hay on to the carpet. You will need to sweep the rabbit living area daily. If a bit of mess drives you up the wall, then an indoor bunny will cause you more stress than pleasure. 15

Furthermore, if you already have other pets, you need to work out how a rabbit will fit in. Rabbits are quite happy to rest during the day, but they will need company and interaction in the mornings and the evenings. Unless you are at home most evenings, your rabbit will be lonely. 20

Be sure that everyone living in your home is eager to have a house rabbit and that they understand the restrictions. For example, everyone will need to remember not to leave books on the floor as they will be nibbled on. Children will naturally want to hold their pets, but must do so carefully. Rabbits will kick, scratch and bite if they feel insecure, and many rabbits die from spinal injuries after being dropped by children. A rabbit can usually live for seven to ten years. The initial costs of the cage and other equipment can be rather high, though day-to-day expenses only amount to a few dollars a week. Beyond these costs, taking on a rabbit is a long-term commitment. Are you ready for a rabbit? 30

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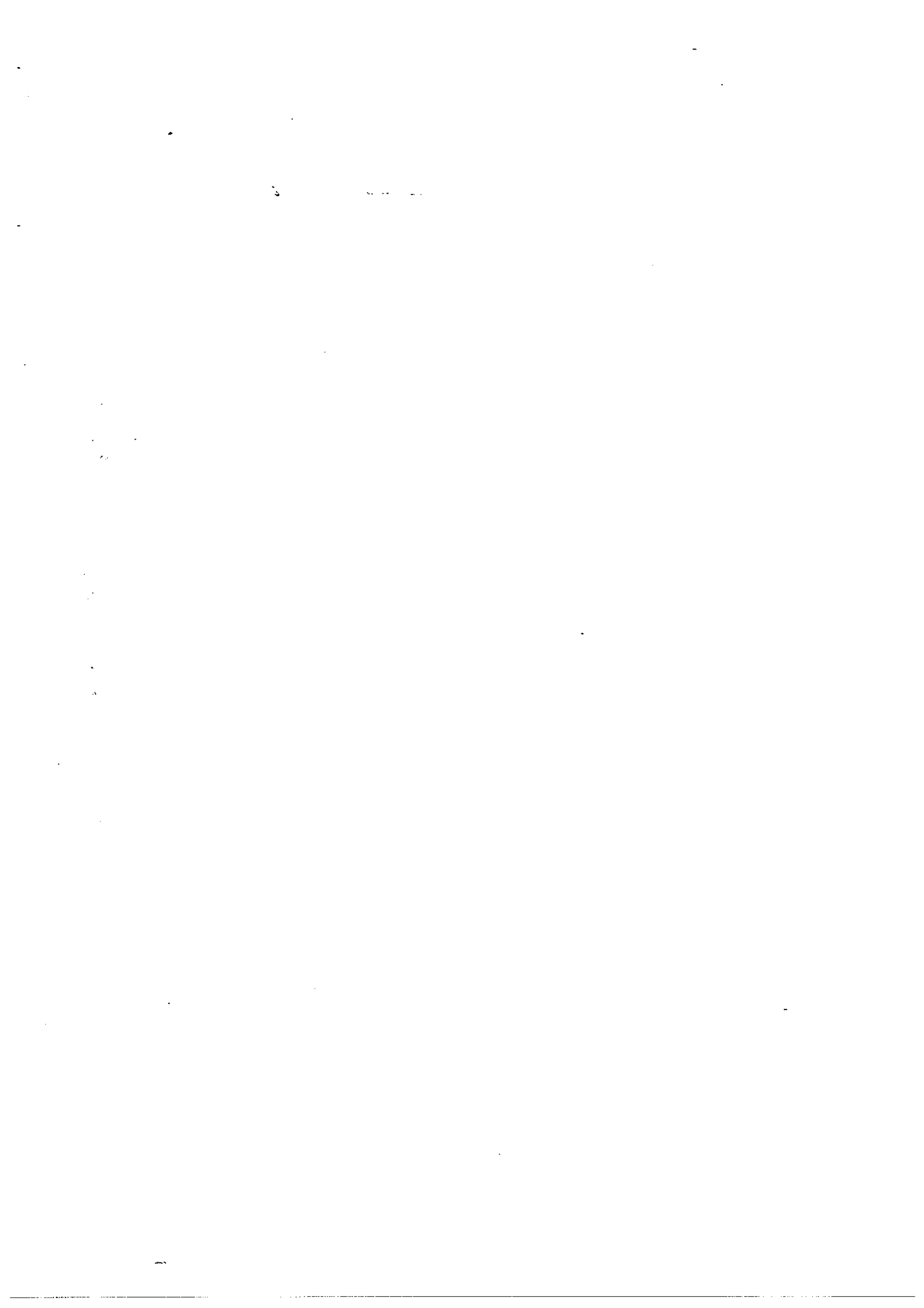
